Pursuant to the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552, as amended, you requested "copies of all records since Jan. 1, 2015 that show the frequency by which professional journalists' phone records were searched via the NSA database and any journalists' overseas conversations were unmasked".

In accordance with Section 3.6(a) of Executive Order 13526, ODNI can neither confirm nor deny the existence or non-existence of the requested records. The fact of the existence or non-existence of the requested records is itself currently and properly classified, and could reveal intelligence sources and methods information that is protected from disclosure pursuant to Section 102A(i)(1) of the National Security Act of 1947, as amended, 50 U.S.C. § 3024(i)(1). Therefore, pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(1) and (b)(3), the ODNI can neither confirm nor deny the existence or nonexistence of records responsive to your request.
